Moments of Deutsche Bank Photographs by Lutz Kleinhans

On the occasion of Deutsche Bank's 150th anniversary, a selection of Kleinhans' photographs are on view in the Forum of the PalaisPopulaire. They focus on everyday situations, technology, and progressive digitalization, as well as the beginnings of the company's commitment to art.

In 2009, the Historical Institute of Deutsche Bank acquired the photographic archive of Lutz Kleinhans (1926–2011), which contains around 18,000 negatives of mostly black-and-white photographs and, from 1970 on, color photographs.

For several decades, Kleinhans documented Deutsche Bank's public appearance and inner workings. The photographer's assignments included the bank's Annual General Meetings in Frankfurt am Main and other major German cities, contract signings, anniversary celebrations, and the company's day-to-day work. The group of motifs for the construction of the Deutsche Bank Towers in Frankfurt at Taunusanlage is also extensive.

Lutz Kleinhans worked as an editorial photographer for the *Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung* from 1973 to 1993. From 1967 he also worked as a "house photographer" for Deutsche Bank until the 1980s.
